Another Step in Revitalizing Main Street

NFTA-METRO and the Angola Village Board have been working together since the summer of 2008 in bringing a Bus Shelter to Main Street along with a Park & Ride much like the one in Athol Springs. The Village is pleased to announce that on Wednesday, April 2nd, the first bus shelter in the Town of Evans was erected in front of the recently landscaped old K&L lot on the corner of Center and North Main Streets. The Park & Ride is located just down the street where commuters can park in the Municipal Parking Lot behind the Red Caboose.

With many anticipated shovel-ready projects for the Village of Angola's Business District, Mayor Frawley welcomed a much-needed edition to the recently updated portion of North Main Street. "When People Inc., opens their Senior Housing unit, the shelter will be within walking distance for the residents to get to where they need to go", stated Frawley while taking a walk through the Village. "It will give more people an opportunity to see all the New Angola Theatre renovations that have been underway these past few months. We hope to see more tourism projects unfold in the near future and more people coming into our Village."

The shelter will accommodate travelers on the Express #76 "Lotus Bay" Route that starts at the Seneca Bingo in Farnham to Downtown Buffalo with connections to alternate NFTA-METRO bus routes at the Athol Springs Park & Ride.
