Regular Board Meeting
Monday, July 11, 2022 5:00 P.M

At Regular meeting of the Village of Angola Board of Trustees held at Village Hall, 41 Commercial Street and via zoom in Angola, New York, County of Erie on Monday, July 11, 2022 at 5:00PM, there were;

PRESENT: Mayor Thomas Whelan, Deputy Mayor John Wilson, Trustees Valerie Stonitsch and John Dybowski, Hannah Dorosz – Deputy Clerk, John Grennell - Village Attorney, Jack Krajacic – DPW Crew Chief, Donald Gallo – Engineer, and Police Chief - Greg Szarowicz, Fire Chief – Anthony Corsaro, Fire Commissioner – Todd Dybdahl

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE was led by Mayor Whelan

Dedicate meeting in honor of people and soldiers of Ukraine that they find peace and resolve.

A motion was made to approve the AUDIT OF BILLS by Trustee Wilson and seconded by Trustee Dybowski, roll call vote was made all said aye.

VISITORS: Bob Sutehall – 37 Woodland Pkwy - asking for regulation to not allow fireworks in Village starting August 1. He used example of Veterans with PTSD / suicide, young children, and elderly being negatively impacted. Mayor Whelan understands where he is coming from and it is not something that can be resolved today.

Pamela Wheeler – 58 North Main – Representing ReDiscover – Read a letter regarding recent lack of permit for food truck on 7/6. They believe temporary use permits should be filed anytime a food truck is on public property also, if a permit was filed and it should have been denied as it would detract from sales and cause financial loss for Village businesses. Mayor Whelan explained Board cannot control businesses unless permits are involved, and the businesses should talk to each other. Wheeler explained because food truck was on public property there should have been a permit filed. Wheeler is asking equal standards to be applied to all businesses. Trustee Wilson said there is merit and it will be looked at.

New Business:

- 1. Downtown Revitalization Initiative – No date for next meeting, Lori and Nicole will schedule a time**
- 2. Stop signs on Dellwood Ave neighborhood – Mayor Whelan drove with Police Chief and Crew Chief – he suggested the intersection of Glenwood and Dellwood be four – way stop, 30MPH speed limit sign moved to 26 Sunset past the Hoag School on right hand sign heading towards Miller Dr.**
- 3. Schedule Court Audit – Mayor Whelan and Trustee Dybowski will schedule with court clerk.**
- 4. Angola Slow Roll August 5, 2022 – Friday Night beginning at 7pm starting at Village Hall, asked Police to guide us. Mr. Sutehall suggested starting and stopping at the same place, somewhere with parking and food is recommended, advertise length of ride**

REPORTS

Code Enforcement - excused, Mayor Whelan read building department report.

Trustee Dybowski- Water loss percentage still high (39%), September report should show if Lake Shore Waterline is making a difference, approximately 85 meters installed. Craft Show & Garden Walk went well, ribbon cutting at Farmers Market, first Gazebo Concert was refreshing to hear new music – thanked Park and Gazebo Committee, Car Show was amazing, bigger and better, thanked Trustee Wilson

Trustee Stonitsch- Agreed with Trustee Dybowski and comments about events, playgrounds have new wood chips - thanked DPW, upcoming events – Hot Dog fundraiser at Library on July 16, Movie Night on July 28, Nickel City Reptiles at Library on July 30.

Trustee Wilson- thanked Friends of the Village for Car Cruise, over 200 cars, thanked Fire Dept, Evans PD, DPW, the Village, Drifters Car Club, every business in Angola, and volunteers Shane Czora and Doug Coleman as security – professional, kind, and helpful. Addressed that Facebook caused a situation involving motorcycles, stressed we do this for everybody. Historically concerns were children near bikes and car doors near motorcycles. Spoke with Kim's and arranged to have motorcycles in front of her business. information received was based on assumptions. Car show was amazing and will continue to host.

Trustee Renaldo- excused

Mayor Whelan- Agreed all events went well.

Crew Chief- received autistic child sign working with state to ensure placement is correct.

Fire Chief- has been meeting with Town fire chiefs to resolve issue with AMR contract. Angola doing well with response rate for calls (~90%). Response time or not showing up are issues with AMR.

Police Chief- no report

Attorney – Reached out to VIO holdings attorney regarding sale of vacant land and has not heard back since last board meeting.

#4 APPROVE SEQR FOR 83 NORTH MAIN STREET PICKLEBALL COURT

WHEREAS a short form Environmental Assessment form has been presented for the Pickleball Court at 83 North Main Street Project and reviewed by the Village Board,

NOW, BE IT RESOLVED

1. That the Village Board declares itself Lead Agency as the project is subject to SEQR
2. That the project is determined to be an unlisted action
3. That the project will not result in significant environmental impacts

Discussion: Trustee Stonitsch asked if it was discussed on where the pickle ball court is going, Trustee Wilson asked if it would be more beneficial to have at Herman Park. Crew Chief said Herman Park is too wet and more parking would be needed. Don Gallo explained SEQR is required for grant at the specific location. Mayor Whelan explained it is already mapped out at K&L Lot, Trustee Wilson questioned if numbers were from a grant and explained how convenient the K&L Lot was for the event. Mayor Whelan explained there will still be green space in the lot. Wheeler asked about restrooms at pickle ball court. Mayor Whelan is working on another grant to have restrooms at Gazebo and will add K&L Lot.

A Roll Call Vote was made and all said Aye.

#5 APPROVE BUDGET MODIFICATION FOR THE 2021-2022 FISCAL YEAR

#7 APPROVE CELEBRATION OF HALLOWEEN

BE IT RESOLVED, the Village of Angola Board of Trustees, hereby declares Saturday, October 29, 2022 from 6:00 PM to 8:00 PM as the day for celebration of Halloween for Tricks and Treats, and authorizes the Village Clerk to publish said article in the local papers.

Discussion: Mayor Whelan explained last year was a success, lines up with Lions Club Parade, will see opposition. Trustee Stonitsch asked Wheeler from a business standpoint if there were any issues last year. Wheeler was supportive said last year went well would like to promote it more this year. Mayor Whelan would like parade to be larger this year. Trustee Stonitsch spoke with Everhaunt and is in support of Saturday Night. Congregational Church has Fall Bazaar scheduled for that day and they coordinate with parade.

A Motion was made by Mayor Whelan, seconded by Trustee Dybowski. Mayor Whelan called, "All in favor say aye". Mayor Whelan, Trustee Stonitsch, and Trustee Wilson - aye, Trustee Dybowski – nay. Trustee Wilson stated he was not sure Trustee Dybowski could do that. No further discussion.

#8 AUTHORIZE PURCHASE OF FIRE ENGINE

BE IT RESOLVED, the Village of Angola Board of Trustees approves the purchase of One Rosenbauer Pumper Fire Engine at a cost not to exceed \$750,000 and, payments are not to exceed \$50,000 per year.

Discussion: Mayor Whelan explained it can be done at those numbers. Sutehall asked year of new truck, it will be brand new and replace fire truck from 1991. Fire Commissioner Dybdahl asked for letter of intent, so price does not increase by end of month.

A Roll Call Vote was made and all said Aye.

#9 APPROVE THE USE OF SOURCEWELL FOR PURCHASE OF FIRE ENGINE

BE IT RESOLVED, the Village of Angola Board of Trustees approves the use of Sourcewell Consortium Corporate Purchasing for the purchase of One Rosenbauer Pumper Fire Engine

Discussion: Trustee Wilson explains Sourcewell is similar to purchasing on state contract and will not have to be sent out for bidding. We will be able to make purchase at reasonable cost.

A Roll Call Vote was made and all said Aye.

Sutehall asked for update on Old Town Hall. Mayor Whelan explained the replacement windows are next and it will be apartments and an Airbnb.

A motion was made to ADJOURN to regular board meeting on Monday, August 8, 2022 at 5:00PM, 4:30 workshop if needed. Mayor Whelan seconded by Trustee Stonitsch, unanimously carried.
