At Regular meeting of the Village of Angola Board of Trustees held at Village Hall, 41 Commercial Street in Angola, New York, County of Erie on Monday, June 13, 2022 at 5:00PM, there were;

PRESENT: Mayor Thomas Whelan, Deputy Mayor John Wilson, Trustees Jason Renaldo, Valerie Stonitsch and John Dybowski, Nicole Milks – Clerk Treasurer, John Grennell - Village Attorney, Jack Krajacic – DPW Crew Chief, Donald Gallo – Engineer, and Police Chief - Greg Szarowicz

Mayor Whelan dedicated the meeting in honor of people and soldiers of Ukraine that they find peace and resolve.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE was led by Mayor Whelan

A motion was made to approve the AUDIT OF BILLS by Trustee Wilson and seconded by Trustee Dybowski, a roll call was made, and all said aye.

VISITORS: Dennis McKloskey of Grand Island offered \$20,000 for the parcel at 161 South Main Street to build an all-steel structure like the fire department building across the street and he will use it for a family storage unit.

Krystal P. of 38 South Main wrote a letter to the village board requesting an autistic child sign near her home. Safety Committee was in attendance and confirmed this is needed and will be installed by the DPW.

New Business:

- 1. 161 South Main Street- Received offer from Dennis McCloskey and VIO Holdings- Mayor Whelan explained the offer from VIO Holdings is less money however there will be housing built and will bring in more revenue than a storage building.**
- 2. Planning Board met with VIO Holdings Group regarding their offer on 3 parcels. Planning Board member Todd Dybdahl explained the board has recommended that the Village Board accepts proposal and there is no need to change zoning as these are “cluster apartments”**
- 3. ReDiscover withdrew Temporary Use application for 6/18 “Feel the Beat”**
- 4. Downtown Revitalization Initiative - Thursday June 16 is the next meeting**
- 5. Accept Resignation from Planning Board Member - Jonica D Martino**

REPORTS

Mayor congratulated Phil on his retirement from the Town of Brant

Code Enforcement reported he attended the planning board meeting and read his monthly report. He also explained campers are allowed in driveways however the current Village code does not mention anything about living in your camper. He also provided a current violation report.

Trustee Dybowski reported that Cody has been installing new Neptune meters and reading the extra routes.

Trustee Stonitsch reported she attended the Memorial Day event, thanked the Clerk Treasurer Nicole Milks for organizing event. She also attended the William G. Houston dedication at Middle School and thanked Trustee John Wilson for his work in the event. July 16th there is a cookout for the library fundraiser and asked the clerk to look into an additional insurance rider to use the land next door.

Trustee Wilson reported he attended the William G. Houston Middle School dedication which went very well and thanked all who attended. The Main Street Cruise is scheduled for July 9, Garden Walk on June 25, and he also thanked fire department for attending dedication ceremony.

Trustee Renaldo reported the first electronic waste event is Saturday 9-12, requested volunteers are needed to attend. He also explained 3 companies contacted for Station 2 repairs.

Mayor Whelan reported a stop sign on Dellwood and Glenwood is needed and would like it to be a 4 way stop sign. Chief of Police suggested driving through the neighborhood to see where stop signs are needed before scheduling any public hearings. The owners of the Movie Theater and the owners of the old Town Hall have asked that the Mayor be the liaison for their property. Memorial Day event went well and thanked Nicole for putting together the program.

Crew Chief reported the seasonal workers are painting gazebo, mulched and weeded the gazebo area, also will order playground chips for parks.

Fire Chief (Todd Dybdahl spoke in his place) reported Deb Smith Village of Sloan leased and purchased a firetruck with Sourcewell.

Police Chief reported they have been seeing delays in AMR responses. Speed signs going out.

Attorney reported okay with temporary use permits that are in the resolutions below. He also confirmed that the sale of the water plant is almost closed and is expecting the \$167,400 be wired into his account any day.

Clerk Treasurer reported the Water Plant Home Rule did not pass and verified the Village will no longer need to submit these documents as the water plant has sold. She also reported that Jack Hazard has submitted a solicitors permit and confirmed with the police chief that the background check has been approved. Mr. Hazard will be starting up an ice cream truck business.

#3 APPROVE ANNUAL SOFTWARE SUPPORT

WHEREAS, the Village has received an Annual Tax Collection/Tax Glance Software Support Contract from Williamson Law-Books in the amount of \$974.00, and an Annual Water Software Support Contract from Williamson Law-Books in the amount of \$1108.00

#5 AUTHORIZE DONATION TO THE BEAUTIFY ANGOLA PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Village of Angola Board of Trustees has received a request from the Friends of the Village to participate in the "Beautify Angola" Project, and

BE IT RESOLVED, the Village of Angola Board of Trustees hereby authorizes to issue payment of \$50.00 to the project to be paid out of line item A7550.4- Community Activities.

#6 APPROVE RENEWAL OF PERMA WORKERS COMPENSATION INSURANCE

WHEREAS, the Village Clerk received renewal documents for the Village of Angola's workers Compensation coverage from PERMA, (public employers risk management association) for the period of 7/1/22-6/30/23,

RESOLVED, cost for the coverage is in the amount of \$48,687.00 of which is broken down at \$24,905.00 for public officials and employees, \$25,285.00 for the Volunteer Firefighters, and \$977 for NYS Assessment AND a credit of \$2480 if paid in full by 7/1/22.

A Roll Call Vote was made and all said Aye.

#7 APPROVE RENEWAL OF NYMIR (NEW YORK MUNICIPAL INSURANCE RECIPROCAL) INSURANCE

WHEREAS, the Village Clerk received renewal documents for the Village of Angola's Municipal Insurance coverage from NYMIR, for the period of 6/1/22-5/31/23,

RESOLVED, cost for the coverage is in the amount of \$40,360.86.

A Roll Call Vote was made and all said Aye.

#8 APPROVE OPEN CONTAINER LAW LIFT

BE IT RESOLVED, the Village of Angola Board of Trustees does hereby lift the open container law on Saturday, June 18, 2022 from 9am-10pm on Main Street only during the Kickoff to Summer Event/Craft Beer Festival held by BTR Brews LLC.

A Motion was made by Trustee Stonitsch seconded by Trustee Dybowski, unanimously carried.

#9 APPROVE FINAL PAYEMENT LAKESHORE WATERLINE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

RESOLVED that the Angola Village Board of Trustees does hereby approve and authorize the Mayor to execute final contract amount with E&R General Construction for the Lake Shore Waterline Replacement Project as recommended by the Village Engineer, Donald Gallo, and authorizes Clerk-Treasurer to pay said final contract amount of \$816,197.00 which includes change order # 1 (add work at the south end of Lake Shore Rd) and change order # 2 (reconnect 2 inch service at St. Vincent DePaul)

Trustee Wilson verified the Village will be billing the town for the hydrants.

A Roll Call Vote was made and all said Aye.

#10 ENDORSE THE 2022 NY MAIN STREET TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM APPLICATION

WHEREAS, the Village of Angola desires to apply for \$20,000 in financial assistance through the 2022 Consolidated Funding Application (CFA) under the New York Main Street Technical Assistance Program Name; and

WHEREAS, the application proposes funding to assist business district property owners within the Village to revitalize and repurpose underutilized commercial, and mixed-use buildings located in the Main Street Business District; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Technical Assistance grant will help property owners make informed decisions regarding the feasibility of rehabilitation that will contribute to ongoing community revitalization efforts; and

WHEREAS, the grant application requires that the applicant obtain the approval and endorsement of the governing body of the municipality in which the project will be located.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village of Angola Board of Trustees approves and endorses the 2022 New York Main Street Technical Assistance Program application for assistance be prepared and to be submitted by the Village of Angola.

A Roll Call Vote was made and all said Aye.

#11 APPROVE ECIDA SERVICE AGREEMENT FOR GRANT PROPOSAL SUPPORT

RESOLVED the Village Board approves Mayor, Thomas Whelan to sign the agreement with ECIDA for grant services up to 25 hours at a rate of \$65.00 per hour totaling \$1625.00.

A Roll Call Vote was made and all said Aye.

#12 SAM (DASNY) GRANT AUTHORIZED OFFICERS

WHEREAS the Village of Angola received a SAM (State and Municipal Facilities Program) Grant through DASNY (Dormitory Authority of the State of NY) Project ID # 25007 in the amount of \$159,000, for the Installation of a Pickle Ball Court, Fencing, Electrical & Lighting at K&L Park and Installation of Drainage and Reconstructing an Exterior Wall at Fire Station 2, and

WHEREAS, Clerk Treasurer, Nicole Milks has been preparing documentation needed for this grant, and

BE IT RESOLVED the Village of Angola Board hereby approves the Village Clerk-Treasurer Nicole Milks and Mayor Thomas Whelan to act as the authorized officers to sign and execute all documentation for this grant project.

A Motion was made by Trustee Stonitsch seconded by Trustee Wilson and a Roll Call Vote was made all said Aye.

#13 ACCEPT ENGINEER PROPOSAL FOR K&L PARK IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, the Village of Angola has been awarded a SAM Grant for the K&L Park Improvement Project, and

WHEREAS, that the Angola Village Board hereby received a proposal for engineering services from the Village Engineer Donald D. Gallo for the K&L Park Improvement Project, and

WHEREAS, said proposal from Village Engineer Donald D. Gallo includes all engineering services at a cost not to exceed \$10,700.00, and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Village Board of the Village of Angola accepts proposal from Village Engineer Donald D. Gallo and hereby authorizes Mayor Thomas Whelan to execute said contract.

A Roll Call Vote was made and all said Aye.

#15 ACCEPT OFFER FROM VIO HOLDINGS GROUP, LLC

WHEREAS, the Village of Angola Board of Trustees has reviewed the offer letter from Vio Holdings Group, LLC and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Angola Planning Board has reviewed the Village Zoning Code and recommends the Village Board accept the offer,

THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED the Village of Angola Board of Trustees accepts the offer from Alex Violanti of VIO Holdings Group LLC to purchase 161 South Main Street sbl 251.07-3-24.2 and 251.07-3-23.12 in the amount of \$7,500.00; Lerczak and Commercial lot sbl 251.07-1-17 in the amount of \$6,500.00; and 28 Mill Street lot sbl 235.12-1-21 in the amount of \$7,500.00 for a total of \$21,500.00.

Trustee Renaldo verified 28 Mill St cannot be sold until September 2023. Village Attorney will work with Violanti's attorney on an agreement.

A motion was made to approve the resolution with the stipulation that Violanti will maintain and mow the 28 Mill Street property until the sale around September 2023.
